

- 6. If not us, then who?



Allocated Funds to Date: \$88,117,404


• **Obligated**: \$40,252,197

  - 4 Admin Accounts = \$3,836,000


29 completed projects

#### October

In theory, before October 1<sup>st</sup>, Congress will pass the final spending package that will include congressional appropriation.

## **Discretionary Grant Facilitation & Assistance**

- Community Grant Readiness Initiative May 13, 2024
- Identifying, coordinating and facilitating the development and submission of **grant** applications for current opportunities.
- Planning for future requests to meet priority needs.
- Identify **infrastructure funding** from the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) and other American Rescue Plan Act competitive grants.
- Grant writing consultant to provide grant research and proposal development.
- Planning for future grant conference, increasing community access to grant training opportunities



## **Discretionary Grant Facilitation & Assistance**

#### **APPLICATIONS AWARDED - 2024**

#### **Community Forestry Grant, in OCM - Sustainability**

Nevada Department of Forestry: Urban & Community Forestry Program - \$279,852 over 3 years

#### Jail-based Mental Health Pilot – Sheriff's Office

Nevada Department Health and Human Services: Jail-based Mental Health Enhancement - \$5,889,952 over 2 years

**TOTAL AWARDED:** \$6,169,804



## **Discretionary Grant Facilitation & Assistance**

#### **APPLICATIONS PENDING**

Climate Pollution Reduction Grant, with US Department of Environmental Protection

US Department of Env Protection: Climate Pollution Reduction Grant – approx. \$10,000,000 over 3 years

**TOTAL REQUESTS PENDING:**\$10,000,000





## **Funding Status**

- Opioid Settlement Recovered Funds to be received until approximately 2043
  - \$41 million over the next 20 years
- \$4.7 million received from the Attorney General's Office (as of April 2024)
- By 12/31/2024 an *expected* \$10.7 million available to distribute
  - subject to **annual reporting** and eligible use requirements.


#### **Fund Distribution**

- Notice of Funding Opportunity anticipated May 2024
- Open competitive grant awards
  - County departments
  - Nonprofit organizations
  - Private entities
- Up to 2-years funding allocations (10/1/2024 9/30/2026)
- Up to 3 contract renewals if programming successful and remains consistent with on the ground needs
- Second funding cycle (10/1/2026 9/30/2028)

### **Evaluation and Selection Criteria**

- Evidence-based or evidence-informed treatment
- Alignment with 2023-2025 Needs Assessment Priorities
- Eligible Use under the One Nevada Agreement and Litigation Settlement
   Agreements
- External and Internal Reviewers will **review** and score proposals
- Selections to be approved by the Board of County Commissioners
  - Both internal and external awards



## Funding Priorities (from Needs Assessment)

Ensure funding for Opioid Use
Disorder comprehensive
services for uninsured and
underinsured Washoe County
residents

Initiate medications for OUD in the emergency department and PRSS to assist with connecting patients to continued care.

Overdose prevention outreach and education to BIPOC communities in a culturally and linguistically appropriate manner.

Implement **Child Welfare best practices** for supporting
families impacted by substance
use.

Increase detoxification and short-term rehabilitation program capacity

## **Examples of Uses of Funds**

- Holistic treatment for opioid use disorders (OUD), and support for persons in recovery;
- Peer support specialists in emergency departments to connect persons with OUD to services, supports, or care;
- Wrap-around home-based services for families impacted by opioid use;
- Development of the workforce of providers of services relating to OUD;
- Services to reduce the harm caused by opioid use;
- Expanding access to medications to treat OUD in emergency rooms;
- Crisis stabilization centers for persons with OUD; and
- Housing for persons who have or are in recovery from OUD;
- Capital projects relating to OUD, including, construction, purchasing, and remodeling; etc.
